The Summit will explore the critical needs required to drive innovation in your community. We will take a deep dive into questions concerning infrastructure, education, community involvement and economic programs. Most importantly, the Summit will address the critical leadership attributes needed to choose a mix of collaborative strategies, governance models, and technologies that will help you make your community ready for the future.

This Summit is an invitation-only program for senior-most executives in the public sector, non-profit advisory boards, and higher education. Other applicants will be reviewed and accepted on a case-by-case basis. This event is complimentary, and there is no tuition fee to attend; however, travel and hotel expenses are the responsibility of individual participants. Attendance is limited, so we encourage you to apply soon.

During the Summit, we will hear from fellow city leaders, including CTOs of major award-winning smart cities, representatives from the European Commission’s Directorate-General for Communications Networks, Content and Technology, major city advisory board members (e.g. London, Dublin, etc.), and leading researchers from Harvard, Maynooth

University, Trinity College Dublin and more.

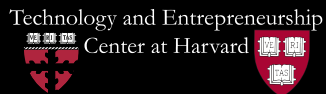
This one-day, intensive Summit will explore both the current challenges and opportunities for smart cities in Europe. We will address important issues such as:
